2 and 3. The School Visit and Grand Harbour Marina Lunch. Wednesday 15th September. Morning and early afternoon.

A bus will arrive at the Victoria Hotel at 0845, ready to depart at 0900, to take you to the school. You don't have to take it but, for those who don't actually live in Malta, it is likely to be the very best way of getting to the School calm and unflustered!

After the School Visit, the bus will take everyone who wants to ride down to the *Riviera della Marina* on the Vittoriosa waterfront. The restaurant has been well chosen for you and you're sure to enjoy it. (Thank you for passing your menu choices to Pauline – that was most useful, and she will have a list, if needed, to remind you of what you chose for the occasion).

After the Lunch, everyone will be able to return to Sliema (or wherever) under their own steam as the public transport facilities are so good¹. You can take buses or taxis from Vittoriosa to Sliema. Another favourite is the "little boat" water taxi from the Grand Harbour Marina to Valetta, and from there to Sliema by little boat again (if it's running) or by bus. Singly or together, it's a journey that everyone is likely to find evocative as well as pleasant and easy.

4. The Reunion Dinner. Thursday 16th September at 7.30 pm at *The Barracuda Restaurant*, Balluta Bay, St Julian's.



The Barracuda is a most excellent restaurant and the staff have been preparing to receive you for some time now. It is a beautifully situated establishment, sitting on the point of Balluta Bay and looking out directly onto the waters of the bay. What's more, some of the best dining areas are now set aside for the Verdala party. It's a restaurant of considerable note on the Island and beyond




Figure 1 - Hotel locations: (with apologies for quality of rendering) Balluta Bay is the location of The Villa at the Méridien Hotel (14th September) and The Barracuda Restaurant (16th September).
